# Chapter 1 – Introduction

The California Wing of the Civil Air Patrol has the area of responsibility over the Golden State. Within the operational boundaries the Wing operates over 155,779 square miles of land and 7916 square miles of water ways.<sup>2</sup> The Wing serves about 40 million people and since 1941, has executed the three missions of Civil Air Patrol: Aerospace Education, Cadet Programs, and Emergency Services.

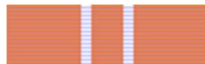

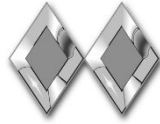

The owner was contacted, and the ELT silenced at 15:07 local.

AFRCC Mission Number 21-M-0089 was opened and closed on 03 March 2021. CAWG was activated to search for an active ELT in the Van Nuys area. An aircraft was launched to locate the signal. The crew acquired the signal soon after becoming airborne and isolated the signal to the northeast side of Whiteman Airport. A UDF team on standby was dispatched and ultimately located the ELT in a Bonanza hangered at the airport. The ELT was subsequently silenced in cooperation with airport staff.

AFRCC Mission Number 21-1-4408 was opened and closed on 04 March 2021. This mission was executed east of Palm Springs in support of Western Air Defense Sector (WADS) training. Target, Highbird and Spare aircraft were launched

AFRCC Mission Number 21-M-0099A was opened in the wee hours of 10 March 2021 and closed on 11 March 2021 for rumors of a crashed helicopter and positive airborne reports of an ELT. Several Santa Clara citizens reported sounds of an explosion and crashing helicopter on the night of 09 March, and when there were positive airborne reports of an ELT signal, AFRCC activated the Civil Air Patrol. Due to bad weather, we were unable to launch an airplane overnight. Three UDF teams did hasty electronic searches of the area, but got only faint signals and were unable to locate the source. During the day on 10 March, two air sorties and multiple UDF sorties were likewise unable to locate any ELT signals. The weather improved somewhat on 11 March, and while the first air sortie was unable to locate a signal, the second did eventually hear an ELT at Fox field (WJF), which was unrelated to the previous helicopter crashing sounds. This ELT was located and silenced. After no evidence of a crashed helicopter

was found, and no helicopters were reported missing or overdue, the LA County Sheriff's office and Civil Air Patrol suspended the search.

AFRCC Mission Number 21-1-4501 was opened and closed on 18 March 2021. The California Wing of the Civil Air Patrol supported a WADS mission in support of the California Air National Guard that was successfully conducted near the Foothill MOA (KFAT).

AFRCC Mission 21-M-0147 was opened on 10 April 2021 and closed on 11 April 2021 to locate and silence a 121.5 signal heard near Merced, CA. An aircrew and UDF team were assembled and launched. Neither the aircrew nor the UDF team was able to acquire the signal. Thanks to my mentor on this mission Maj. Christian. Thank you to everyone who responded to the alert and to those members below who participated in the search.

AFRCC Mission 21-M-0226 was opened on 24 May 2021 and Closed on 25 May 2021 for an ELT in the vicinity of Hollister Airport (KCVH). An aircrew and UDF team were formed out of KRHV and KWVI respectively, and the ELT was found at the Frazier Lake Airpark. We were unable to gain access to the hangar that night, and so the mission was suspended overnight. In the morning, the airport manager didn't hear a signal at the hangar identified the previous night, so a second aircrew and an UDF team was dispatched, and localized the signal to a different hangar. The ELT was located in a Glasair N467DK and silenced.

AFRCC Mission Number 21-1-4989 was opened 27 May 21 and closed 27 May 21 in which California Wing of the Civil Air Patrol supported FK 21-475, an intercept training flight for the 144th FW. Thank you to the crews who were signed up but were not needed to fly.

AFRCC Mission Number 21-M-0256 was opened 4 June 21 and closed 5 June 21 for a 121.5 MHz distress radio beacon in Sonoma County. Our UDF team was dispatched and was able to locate and deactivate the beacon at a private residence.

AFRCC Mission Number 21-M-0155 was opened 16 April 21 and closed 17 April 21 for a 121.5 MHz distress radio beacon in the Sacramento area. An aircrew and UDF team were dispatched to DF the signal. The beacon was located in an aircraft at Yolo County Airport and was silenced the next business day.

AFRCC Mission Number 21-1-5258 was executed 8-July-21 in the Fresno area in support of Western Air Defense Sector (WADS) training. Target and Highbird aircraft were launched

The beacon travelled north in a truck and was silenced on a salvaged aircraft in a hangar at Chino Airport KCNO around 0230L. Our teams did a fantastic job given the complexity of the search including tracking a signal traveling northbound on the freeway. Non-distress credits were given per the attached closing notification. Thank you for your support and participation in this important opportunity to be a force multiplier for the U.S. Air Force.

AFRCC Mission Number 21-M-0626 was opened 23 DEC 21 and closed 23 DEC 21 for a 406Mhz ELT with a 121.5Mhz carrier transmitting somewhere in the area of Nevada County Airport (KGOO) in Northern California. CAP aircraft were unable to fly due to poor weather conditions, and a UDF team was assembled and dispatched to KGOO. While enroute to the airport, AFRCC informed the IC that the signal stopped transmitting, and the UDF team was asked to return to base. Thank you for all who participated in this mission, and I appreciate your commitment and effort to be a critical force multiplier for the U.S. Air Force.

### Colonel George Ishikata



George was a valuable and much-loved member of the CAP family and will be missed. Col Ishikata's death was a shock and completely unexpected. CAP is a family and we have lost a valued member. We mourn together and take comfort from each other's support. Ishikata's CAP career began in 1977, when he served as a cadet before embarking on a career in the U.S. Army. Over the ensuing 43 years he served at multiple levels of CAP, helping lead the California Wing's San Francisco Cadet Squadron – one of the California Wing's most successful squadrons – and at the wing and region levels.

He was national Cadet Programs staff coordinator from September 2017 until his tenure as region commander began. He also served with CAP's national Cadet Officer School and with the International Air Cadet Exchange.

Ishikata retired from the Army as a colonel after nearly three decades. He served as an Army military intelligence officer, holding sensitive intelligence positions at the highest levels in Iraq, Afghanistan, and Kosovo.

He received two Defense Superior Service Medals from the Army, the Legion of Merit Award, and a Bronze Star Medal, as well as five Meritorious Service Medals. Other military honors include the Federal Asian/Pacific American Council Meritorious Service Award, which he received in 2006.

### Lieutenant Colonel Eugene Alfaro



It is with a heavy heart that I inform you that Lt. Col. Eugene Alfaro our Aerospace Education officer passed away on Friday December 24, 2021. Lt. Col. Alfaro would want us to remember him with smiles and dreams of aviation, science, and technology. Lt. Col. Alfaro served with Squadron 201 since he joined 12 Sept 2011. However, Lt. Col. Alfaro joined Civil Air Patrol long before that. He joined Civil Air Patrol as a young teenager in the 1950's and then went on to serve in the United States Air Force reaching the rank of Lieutenant Colonel before retiring. Lt. Col. Alfaro served in the USAF from 1956 to 1987 with his last duty assignment as Air Operations. In the Air Force Lt. Col. Eugene Alfaro was awarded the Air Force Meritorious Service Award (1976) , The Distinguished Flying Cross (1972), the Army Good Conduct Medal (1959), the Air Force Overseas Ribbon (Long) (1960, 1980), the Air Force Overseas Ribbon (short) (1973), the Air Force Presidential Unit Citation (1971, 1972), the

Vietnam Gallantry Cross (1972), the Air Medal (1971), Air Force Longevity Award (1961, 1965, 1969, 1973, 1977, 1981, 1985), Defense Meritorious Service Medal (1984, 1987), Air Force Unit Award (Pre 2014) (1971), Air Force Training Ribbon (1971), Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon (1963), National Defense Service Medal (2001-Present) (1960), Air Force Commendation Medal (1958- 2015) (1962), Air Force Outstanding Unit Award (Pre 2014) 1971(x2), 1972), Air Medal (1971 (x5), 1972), Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal (1972), and the Vietnam Service Medal (1971, 1972). Over the years in Civil Air Patrol, he has held the positions of Aerospace officer (Senior rating), Finance officer, Professional Development officer, Testing Officer, and served as the Chair for Unit Promotion Board, Membership Board and Awards Review Board. He completed Level 1 and Level 2 in Civil Air Patrol and passed the Yeager Award in 2016 and the Davis Award in 2018. In addition to Civil Air Patrol, Lt. Col. Alfaro was a member of the following organizations and served as President of the Distinguished Flying Cross Society.

He also served his squadron in many cadet staff positions such as Gideon, Cadet Flight Sergeant, Cadet Deputy Flight Commander, Cadet Flight Commander, Cadet Leadership Officer, Cadet Emergency Services Officer, Deputy Cadet Commander, Cadet Commander, and CAC representative.

In 1993 Maj Taylor transferred from cadet to senior member with the grade of Captain. He continued to serve his squadron as Testing Officer, Emergency Service Officer, Aerospace Education Officer, Records Officer, Safety Officer.
